## SCHEDULING ORDER SETTING CIVIL TRIAL DATE AND PRETRIAL SCHEDULE, REQUIRING MEDIATION, AND REFERRING CERTAIN MOTIONS TO MAGISTRATE JUDGE

THIS CAUSE is set for trial during the Court's two-week trial calendar beginning on Monday, December 01, 2025 in the Miami Division before Judge Darrin P. Gayles at the Wilkie D. Ferguson Jr. U.S. Courthouse, 400 North Miami Avenue, Courtroom 11-1, Miami, Florida. The Telephonic Calendar Call will be held at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, November 26, 2025. A Telephonic Status Conference will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 24, 2025. The parties shall adhere to the following schedule:

1.	Joinder of any additional parties and filing of motions to amend the complaint by	9/27/2024
2.	Written lists containing the names and addresses of all witnesses intended to be called at trial by	4/1/2025
3.	Motion for class certification shall be filed by	6/27/2025
4.	Parties shall disclose experts, expert witness summaries, and reports as required by Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(2) by	5/16/2025
5.	Exchange of rebuttal expert witness summaries and reports as required by Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(2) by	5/30/2025

6.	Parties shall select a mediator pursuant to Local Rule 16.2 and shall schedule a time, date, and place for mediation by	1/10/2025
7.	Fact discovery shall be completed by	5/2/2025
8.	Expert discovery shall be completed by	6/13/2025
9.	Dispositive motions, including motions for summary judgment, and <i>Daubert</i> motions, shall be filed by	8/1/2025
10.	Mediation shall be completed by	8/29/2025
11.	All pretrial motions and memoranda of law, including motions in limine, 1 shall be filed by	10/1/2025
12.	Joint pretrial stipulation, proposed joint jury instructions, proposed joint verdict form, and/or proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law <sup>2</sup> shall be filed by	11/3/2025

Motions. Every motion filed in this case shall be accompanied by one proposed original order granting the motion. Each party shall be limited to filing one (1) motion in limine. Unless otherwise specified by the Court, every motion shall be double spaced in 12-point Times New Roman typeface. Multiple Plaintiffs or Defendants shall file joint motions with co-parties unless there are clear conflicts of position.

Referral to Magistrate Judge. Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636, all discovery matters are referred to Magistrate Judge Jonathan Goodman to take all appropriate action. Furthermore, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(c)(1), the parties may consent to trial and final disposition by Judge Goodman.

<u>Status Conferences and Calendar Call</u>. The parties shall attend any status conference held in this matter and the calendar call by telephone. Counsel shall enter their appearances

telephonically using the following dial-in information: **Dial-in Number 305-990-2559**; **Phone Conference ID 374 050 271**#. Please dial in at least ten minutes before the status conference begins and wait until your case is called.

Mediation. The parties shall select a mediator pursuant to Local Rule 16.2 and shall schedule a time, date, and place for mediation. If the parties cannot agree on a mediator, they shall notify the Clerk in writing as soon as possible, and the Clerk shall designate a certified mediator on a blind rotation basis. Counsel for all parties shall familiarize themselves with and adhere to all provisions of Local Rule 16.2. Within seven (7) days of mediation, the parties are required to file a mediation report with the Court.

**Discovery.** The parties may stipulate to extend the time to answer interrogatories, produce documents, and answer requests for admissions. The parties shall not file with the Court notices or motions memorializing any such stipulation unless the stipulation interferes with the deadlines set forth above. The Court must approve all stipulations that would interfere with the schedule deadlines. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. 29. In addition to the documents enumerated in Local Rule 26.1(b), the parties shall not file notices of deposition with the Court. Strict compliance with the Local Rules is expected, particularly with regard to motion practice. *See* S.D. Fla. L.R. 7.1.

<u>Discovery Disputes</u>. No written discovery motions, including motions to compel, for protective order, or related motions for sanctions shall be filed unless the Magistrate Judge requests them.

<u>Deposition Designations</u>. Parties seeking to use deposition testimony at trial shall provide the Court with a full deposition transcript. The designations shall be color coded, with each party highlighting the deposition testimony it intends to use in a specific color. Objections to designations shall be included in the margins of the transcript.

Electronic Submission of Exhibits. Pursuant to Local Rule 5.3(b)(2) regarding electronic submission of exhibits, counsel must file in the CM/ECF system electronic versions of documentary exhibits within ten (10) days of the conclusion of the hearing or trial in which they were introduced.<sup>3</sup> At the time of filing the electronic exhibits, an attorney for each party shall also complete and file the attached Certification of Compliance re Admitted Evidence. Electronically filed exhibits are subject to CM/ECF Administrative Procedures, Section 6, Redaction of Personal Information, Privacy Policy, and Inappropriate Materials. Failure to file the electronic exhibits and Certification of Compliance by the date enumerated above may result in the imposition of sanctions. Any original exhibits that have been returned to, or retained by, the filing party after electronic filing shall be kept for safe keeping until the conclusion of any appeals. Upon order of the Court, the filing party must return the original exhibits to the Clerk of Court.
