4. Exchange of rebuttal expert witness summaries and reports as required by Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(2) by **12/15/2025**
5. Fact discovery shall be completed by **12/1/2025**
6. Expert discovery shall be completed by **1/15/2026**
7. Dispositive motions, including motions for summary judgment, and *Daubert* **3/10/2026**

motions, shall be filed by

8. Mediation shall be completed by **3/16/2026**
9. All pretrial motions and memoranda of law, including motions in limine,¹ shall be filed by **4/15/2026**
10. Joint pretrial stipulation, proposed joint jury instructions, proposed joint verdict form, and/or proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law² shall be filed by **5/18/2026**
